

### Overview

This course covers the body of knowledge required for TOGAF® 9 certification. The course is offered as an associate of Inspired.org, a multinational focused on delivering services and tooling in the areas of IT strategy, enterprise architecture and business change. The course is accredited with The Open Group.

Successful delegates, after passing the independent examination, may register with the Open Group as certified TOGAF 9 Architects, becoming part of a select international community. The course is about more than just certification though and goes beyond simply covering the body of knowledge in the TOGAF® manual. Additional material is provided in order to put EA and modern architectures such as Service-Oriented Architecture (SOA) into perspective. An in-depth, realistic case study illustrates the application of techniques through a typical architecture implementation lifecycle.

On successful completion of the course, delegates must sit and pass an independent online examination administered by PearsonVUE on behalf of the Open Group. This can be done at the conclusion of training or scheduled later at the delegate's convenience. A voucher for one sitting of the exam is provided as part of the course fee.

Delegates who do not pass the exam will not be registered with the Open Group. The cost of registration of successful delegates is included in the course fee.

### Course Assessment

There is no formal assessment but delegates are required to attend all course days and actively participate in the exercises, discussions and feedback.

Delegates should already be in, or be strongly motivated to move into, a role which requires enterprise level architectural thinking and responsibility.

This course combines instructor-led seminars and group work built around a comprehensive case study, enabling delegates to practice the tools and techniques covered.
